



TRAVEL TO GREEN RIVER

We suggest flying into Grand Junction (GJ), Colorado, and then taking Amtrak to Green River. Just ensure your plane to GJ lands around 2PM, giving you enough time to get to the train station via public bus or taxi. Amtrak departs GJ around 4PM.

If you fly into Salt Lake City (SLC) or Provo (PVU) because it is cheapest, be forewarned that they're quite far from Green River! Amtrak runs from SLC (4AM) to Provo (4:30AM) to Green River (8AM). If you plan to arrive in SLC, we suggest researching bus options (greyhound.com and elevatedtransit.com) to Green River before purchasing your flight. Renting a car at SLC or PVU would be a great option especially if you plan to carpool with others.




AIRPORTS LISTED IN ORDER OF OUR RECOMMENDATION

- GJT - Grand Junction Regional Airport, CO - Walker Field (102 miles)
- PVU - Provo Municipal Airport (142 mi)
- SLC - Salt Lake City (186 mi)
- DEN - Denver (365 mi)

There's no better arrival to Green River than via Amtrak's California Zephyr. The train goes each direction once a day, arriving from the west at 7:59 AM and from the east at 5:58 PM. The line runs from Chicago to San Francisco (both hubs to other Amtrak lines). There are AAA, student, and early bird discounts for Amtrak.

TRAVEL WITHIN GREEN RIVER



Green River is small enough to bike or walk everywhere. Having a car is helpful if you want the freedom to go out exploring the area especially to the nearby National and State Parks. We expect to shuttle and carpool people around during Summer Summit. Please let us know if you have any accessibility concerns.

If you bring your bike, be prepared for flat tubes from goatheads (thorns). We recommend having kevlar tires, smart slime, patch kits, and/or extra tubes. Also, if you arrive via Amtrak and wish to bring your bike on board, note that it will have to be boxed up amongst other complications.

WEATHER

Fall is arguably the best time of year to be in Green River. We can expect hot days and cold nights (Low 50, High 80). Be prepared for wind and/or rain.



FOOD & ALCOHOL

Though Green River has only one small grocery store, it will probably have everything you need (though maybe not everything you want). Epicenter encourages visitors to purchase all food locally, if possible. Green River has a few restaurants, multiple fast food spots, a stationary taco truck, and a coffee shop.

Green River is known for its melon! Summer Summit will happen at the tail-end of the season, so be ready for fresh melon, pumpkin, and more.



Current Utah law sets a limit of 3.2 percent alcohol by weight (4 percent by volume) in beer sold at grocery and convenience stores and at establishments operating under a "beer only" type license. "Real" beer, wine, and liquor is available at the minimal State Liquor Store in Green River (located in the West Winds Restaurant's gift shop).


